PTFA News - ASDA Cashpots For Schools Campaign

School Admissions – Reception class & High School

Applications for primary (Reception) and high schools (Year 7) places for September 2025 is now open and can be accessed at https://my.northtyneside.gov.uk/category/129/school-admissions

- Year 7 high school admissions must be completed and submitted by 31st October 2024.
- Reception class admissions must be completed and submitted by 13th January 2025.

Please note applications for places at Catholic schools do require supporting evidence of baptismal certificates if applying under a Catholic category. If you require a copy of your baptismal certificate please contact the church where your child was baptised as early as possible. For GDPR reasons, this must be a written request not an email/telephone call.

Attendance & Punctuality

Just to remind you that the school day starts at 8.55am with the school doors opening at 8.45am.

As you may have heard in the news this week, in August the DfE issued new statutory guidance to schools to improve school attendance. In line with that guidance please read the information below:

- Registers are taken from 8.55am and will remain open for 30 minutes.
- Any pupils arriving after 9am will be marked as 'late before register closes'.
- Any pupil arriving after the register closes will be marked as an unauthorised absence.
- Please note that holidays should not be taken in term time and will not be authorised; if a holiday is taken and meets the new threshold of 10 sessions* within a period of 10 weeks, we may refer the matter to the Local Authority who may issue a penalty notice. The penalty notice has increased to £80 per parent, per child.

(*1 session = a morning/afternoon session)

Our current Attendance & Punctuality Policy is in the process of being updated and will be shared with you once approved by Governors.

Statutory Assessment Dates

Each year statutory assessments are carried out for certain year groups in the summer term. This year's dates are as follows:

- Year I Phonics Screening check Week beginning Monday 10th June 2025
- Year 4 Multiplication check Week beginning 2nd June 2025
- Year 6 Key Stage 2 SATs Monday 12th May to Thursday 15th May 2025

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Staff Car Park

For the safety of pupils, staff and adults walking into school via the main drive, I'd like to remind parents/carers that they should not be driving down into the car park to drop off and collect children (unless this has been prearranged with the school office), including when collecting children from after school clubs.

Parking Outside of School

I'd like to remind all parents/carers that when parking in the local residential streets or on Great Lime Road to not park across residents' driveways. I have also been concerned to hear about parents/carers parking on double yellow lines at the bottom of Elm Grove when dropping off in the mornings which is making it dangerous for all pedestrians, including our pupils when crossing the road. In addition to this, I have been alerted to a recent event where parents/carers were arguing aggressively on Elm Grove over parking which is unnecessary and unpleasant for others, including young children to witness. Please ensure you are being considerate and parking safely at all times. As always the church car park is always available for parking and it is only a short walk to school from there.
